We would like to thank Amy for organising the tree once again , and Councillor Macpherson for installing the tree and the lights.


### **Stell Inspection**

In December, we undertook the bi annual inspection of the Potto Stell system. The stell network is a combination of open and culverted waterways that directs the water from field drains through the residential areas of Potto and finally drains into Potto Beck. This ensures that the low-lying areas of Potto are adequately drained behind the flood barrier.

Residents are to be commended for maintaining the stell system in good order. A few areas of improvement were noted and these were followed up with the land owners.

# **New Council for North Yorkshire**

On 21 July the government decided that the current councils would be replaced by a new, single council for everyone in North Yorkshire with City of York Council remaining as it is.

The new council will be simpler and easier for the public to access. There will be one council with one point of contact for all the support and services.

Around 30 local access points around the county will give everybody, everywhere the chance to have direct, face to face contact about services.

The new council will aim to drive a revolution in empowering communities. There will be new powers and money for local people across communities, market towns and parishes to drive local change, local enterprise and local solutions:

- local priorities will be decided by initially around 25 community networks based around market town areas
- greater powers and funding will pass to parish and town councils for those that would welcome it
- there will be greater transparency through powerful area constituency committees that will hold the new North Yorkshire council to account on issues such as planning and transport
- there will be just one set of councillors who will be accountable for all services

### **Bridge Over Swainby Ellers**



The Parish Council in partnership with Swainby Parish Council and the District and County Councillors have been working closely with NYCC highways in-order to replace the old footbridge over Swainby Ellers and provide better access to the countryside for all.

Funding was provided through Grants, Contributions from the two parishes and contributions from NYCC.

The work was completed earlier this year, and the parish council received this email from David Hughes just after the bridge had been opened, David has kindly given his permission for us to share his email.

Dear Council Members.

I am a regular walker around the Potto area along with my disabled daughter and we particularly enjoy the accessible footpath between Cooper Lane and Swainby Beck. The width of the original footbridge across the beck precluded us travelling further as her wheelchair would not fit within the confines of the bridge. A month or two ago, during one of our walks, we bumped in to Mr. Ian Macpherson who advised that the bridge would shortly be replaced with a wider unit with a view to extending the accessible area to the less able. We have spent quite a lot of time away of late for various reasons but we went out walking in Potto only yesterday and were delighted to find the new bridge has been installed

It is particularly commendable that a relatively small parish council have the foresight to try and open up the countryside to the less able like this and we would like to express our gratitude. We can now extend our walks greatly and the cafes at Swainby are within reach. I have attached a photograph of my daughter enjoying her first trip across the new bridge.

As mentioned we are quite regular walkers here, despite living outside the area, and a contribution which may go some way towards helping other less able people through your Parish Council is a very worthy cause.

Once again, thank you so much for helping to open up the countryside to us and we look forward to further enjoying Potto and it's surroundings for years to come.

### Traffic Calming in the Village

One of the items highlighted in the Potto Parish Plan was reducing the speed of traffic within the village.

The Parish Council together with Crathorne and Seamer Parish Councils submitted a joint bid to North Yorkshire Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner AJ1 Project Road Safety fund which was successful in securing funds for the project. Unfortunately due to the issues around Covid-19 production of the units have been delayed, the good news is that they should be available for installation early in the New Year.



### Planning Issues in the Parish

Planning is a very emotive subject to those who are closely affected by it. Potto Parish Council is a small part of the planning process in that we can provide opinions but are not responsible for granting or refusing planning permission.

The parish council is acutely aware of some of the planning issues raised by members of the public regarding some of the decisions made by Hambleton planning for our parish.

We have raised these to Hambleton's Chief Planning Officer Mr Jon Berry who has been receptive to our concerns and attended the December Meeting of the parish council to answer some of the parish councils concerns over decisions made on recent planning applications.

He also answered some of the questions posed by members of the public at the meeting.

The parish council explained that we are committed to working closely with the planning team to improve communications between the district and the parish as this seems to be the area that is causing the biggest problems. Questions were also raised as to why decisions often go against the local input provided by the parish council who are best placed to raise specific local concerns and issues

Understanding the reasons behind planning decisions and being able to communicate these to parishioners is something that we hope to improve on working more closely with HDC planning in 2022.
